- 1. We need to be sure that the references to best available science (BAS) remains in the proper statutory context. It is primarily designed to inform the process, not override or direct actions. A proper balance needs to be maintained between local conditions and policy needs.
- 2. No mention is made of the Voluntary Stewardship Program (VSP) which is a significant program in 27 counties dealing with critical area protection and enhancement where agriculture exists within crucial areas. A prominent reference should be made in the guidance

to remind the 27 counties that critical areas (including CARAs) are handled through the VSP in those 27 counties with an approved county VSP watershed plan.
