Also, I was at the Occidental site with the News Tribune about 10 days ago and saw that, next door, PSE is moving fast ahead with work on the LNG proposed facility.

Besides all of the theoretical, hypothetical and real problems with the LNG plant itself, the big current problem that I saw is that they were digging, pounding and excavating and kicking up dirt and dust that rose dozens and dozens of feet high (I could see it over the fence, as I waited for the news tribune) Then the wind swept all of that all over (and no doubt miles away).

And as I'm waiting, I saw about 10-15 trucks enter and leave the site in the 20 minutes I was there, and they were carrying dirt and dust not only in their loads (to dump where?) but on their tires and vehicle sides.

So my question is has Ecology done tests at the new LNG site both above ground and underground to determine the level of contaminants at every/any depth that they are going to drill/excavate.

Many of those particles are heading straight for Crescent heights and browns point elementary schools and meeker middle school...not to mention the thousands of us that live in Browns point.
