Here are my comments for Tacoma's Occidental Chemical cleanup:

- I would like to learn the estimated health hazards such as incidental ingestion and dermal contact for the clean up options that are being considered.
- While evaluating the clean up options, the cost should be the least determining factor. We should focus on the health of our citizens and our environment as the top priority and the top determining factor
- I took the attached slide from the Public Presentation. The Slide shows the cross section of the plume view looking to the east. The most recent data is from 2004-2013. How far has the plume expanded since this data is taken? Aren't supposed to get more recent data before the cleanup method is selected? Besides we need the most recent data to understand what our current exposure is
- Is there a simple comparison matrix of the clean up alternatives being considered? I would like to see a comparison by Containment Success, Health Concerns, Project Duration, etc.
- What are the current health hazards via soil, water and air contamination?
- During the application of the chosen remedy, what are the projected health hazards via soil, water and air contamination? How are these hazards going to be monitored? What is the frequency of the monitoring? Where will this monitoring data be stored? Will the citizens have access to this data?
- Is there going to be an independent 3rd party who is auditing and monitoring the Clean up efforts ? Our are you relying on Occidental Chemical Corporation to do the monitoring ? If latter is the case, does not that pose a conflict of interest ?
