

Clark County

- (1) Is 555.070 saying that local government is responsible for the battery disposal cost at HHW events? Or that the stewardship organization will cover the HHW event disposal costs?
- (2) "Special location" recycling suggestion: Homeless shelters / aid organizations could be collection sites. People experiencing homelessness are more reliant on single-use batteries. There is demand - the solid waste program at the City of Vancouver is interested in battery recycling for their homeless assistance programs.
- (3) "Special location" recycling suggestion: provide battery recycling options for litter clean-up crews.
- (4) "Special location" recycling suggestion: Schools or during school special events.
- (5) Reporting requirements. Are there requirements for quantitative data specific to education work?
- (6) Consider adding language that gives you the ability to request changes to the format/display of data reported by the organization (if they submit poorly constructed spreadsheets for example).
- (7) Considering adding more requirements of a stewardship organization's public-facing website. It needs to be accessible, easy to navigate, contain all relevant information about the program, map of recycle locations, etc. (I am thinking about the messy website situation with the DOH safe medication disposal program. It sounded like the DOH coordinators didn't have a lot of control over the website problems with Med-Project and Inmar Intelligence).
