I have two main concerns about the proposed cleanup plan:

1) The location of the proposed parking lot route visitors through residential neighborhoods rather than around on the more arterial and well-travelled Dockton Road. To reduce traffic and other impacts to the Upper Gold Beach neighborhoods, it would be preferable for the parking lot be located closer to existing Dockton Park parking lots and the trail access points toward that end of the cleanup site.

2) Because of cleanup site interacts and intersects with other trails that are not specifically included in the cleanup site, it is difficult to have a clear image of which trails are being proposed for capping and closure. It would be incredibly helpful to have an on-site walk-through with trail users in order to better understand specifically which trails are under discussion and how that impacts use and access of adjoining trails.

I love the trails as is, I wish the connecting trail that runs parallel to the beach just above the high tide line were one that could be re-opened or reinstated. It's a great option for connecting the trail system at high tide and provides some pretty spectacular views.
