"The owner may not be required to tell you or the public what the plans for the property are, even though that is the first thing that you as a neighbor want to know. And if they tell you, often there is no penalty for lying or changing their mind," which is what we are concerned about*. How can we possibly trust what PacWest is telling us? What recourse do we have when we find out they have lied?
