Western States Petroleum Association (WSPA) appreciates the opportunity to provide input on the Department of Ecology WAC Rulemaking Chapter 173-423, 173-400-025. WSPA is a trade association that represents companies that explore for, produce, refine, transport and market petroleum, petroleum products, natural gas, and other energy supplies in Washington and four other western states.

The way the world produces and consumes energy is evolving. The members of WSPA are on the cutting edge of those changes, investing in and developing the diverse energy sources and technologies of the future. WSPA understands that Ecology is not required to adopt EPA's revised major NSR applicability test. However, doing so would streamline the permitting process and we request that Ecology consider aligning these rules to be consistent with the EPA rules that are being implemented.
