These comments are general ones on the entire effort:

- Thank you, first, to Ecology, for all the work into this major project that, if regulations are followed correctly, appears this will be a large agent of change in our state.
- So much value gained by consulting with California. Our state has been difficult for political reasons. This effort to go above is beyond anything I've seen in Washington state towards clean air changes. (As I recall Wes Pruitt's Saturday morning meetings in Gig Harbor, as he worked so hard to pass the Clean Air Act - must have been mid-'80's.)
- The third party verification process is a needed step, for sure, as well as tightening limits on time and amount of pollution discrepancies allowed in reporting.
- 1 question: Under 3241 Petroleum Products Manufacturing, I'm assuming it includes manufacture of plastics products, but wanted to make sure of this. I am unaware of amount of this industry in Washington, but anything we can do needs to be done. Do fines include use of plastics in packaging? I believe this should be fit into the process at whatever stage is possible.
