Background: I am an individual that owns an electric car and am happy with it. For over 50 years I have been interested in transportation and vehicles. I have a doctorate in science and an interested in energy in most forms.

Comments: There will not be sufficient electrical infrastructure to support the number of electric cars anticipated. Observe how in CA there are brownouts currently with small numbers of electric cars.
