Dear Department of Ecology: There are two locations where pulp mill emissions continue to affect local communities significantly. One of these is the tiny community of Port Hadlock. Port Hadlock has roughly 1/2 the median income of bigger cities like Seattle, and yet bears the burden of the air pollution from the Pulp Mill in Port Townsend. The smell is quite noxious and affects daily life there. I have spent time in the community vacationing and was alerted to this issue then. The small towns in Washington should not have to bear the burden of pollution while not benefiting from the profits made from the company when they continue to pollute the air of the neighboring community. The same is true of Tacoma and the air pollution from the pulp mill there. While prevailing winds seem to limit the affect of the smelter on most of Old Town Tacoma, the pulp mill pollution can still be smelled from time to time. I'd like to request that Department of Ecology consider looking at the demographics of these communities and not let overburdened communities suffer from poor air quality. thank you.
