The proposed restrictions will not have any impact on global temperatures. This is easily evaluated using quantitative analysis against the whole world context. No advantage is gained, but much harm is done in making access to affordable cooling more expensive. Those who will be harmed will include those most vulnerable to heat stress and least likely to be able to afford expensive -1-fixes-1- that don't fix anything. A better priority might be to reduce heat in urban settings - more shade and better reflection of summer sun. That will help people now, by helping them adapt.
