Will all county operations be included in this policy process and regulations?

Are there permitting difference in different counties? In Yakima County our rules are often based around industrial exporting businesses or industry that do not correspond the other county requirements because Yakima county operates differently claiming an agricultural allowance. This would not apply to the landfill where our Yakima County representatives have not been truthful with our community about the local landfill being close to maximum capacity without thought of future costs they will pass on to taxpayers. They also do not abide by state EPA clean air permitting rules due to an agricultural allowance where most of our community is no longer agricultural, it is industrial. Current WA maps do not reflect the GHG concrete facilities, nor to they reflect any information about our local landfill emissions that the public can understand to have rebuttal against our county officials.
