I support including all consumer products on the draft priority product list. It identifies many consumer products that expose humans and orcas to the five toxic chemicals. They impact the Southern Resident orcas and disproportionately impacted communities.

However, a more comprehensive list of consumer products with toxic chemicals is necessary that I urge Ecology to consider. The present list doesn't represent enough major sources for toxic exposure. The proposed products alone are insufficient: toxic exposures will still cause significant harm to our communities and environment. Please expand this list of consumer products.
