This report is terribly inadequate.

- It suggests that local taxpayers should absorb the cost of dealing with PFAS contamination, though local government actions are not the reason for the contamination. The Navy should bear those costs.
- Further, it suggests that since replacement products are poorly understood, we should continue to tolerate PFAS contamination. Yet we understand PFAS and their dangers more than well enough to ban them now. A ban would also jump-start the search for replacements.
