Dear Washington State Department of Ecology,

Thank you for the proposed restrictions on toxic chemicals in product categories such as carpets and textiles, electronics, and personal care products. In many cases, adoption of rules would make Washington the first state to ban the chemical class in the named product category.

We are all exposed to toxic chemicals like PFAS and phthalates in products we use in our daily lives. A recent study tested breast milk from 50 Washington mothers and found PFAS in 100% of the samples. This is an urgent crisis that must be addressed immediately. Washington residents deserve to know that the products they use are safe and free from toxic chemicals that impact our health and pollute the environment.

I support the proposed restrictions in all product categories as an important next step in achieving this goal.
