I checked with my staff and the <mark>biggest potential impact/concern is that industry be given</mark> enough time to reformulate their products to meet these new requirements if they had the prohibited chemicals in them.

We would need to rely on the product manufacturers to identify if the chemicals mentioned in the legislation are present as we don't have the time nor expertise to go through every material looking for the prohibited chemicals.

We did identify a printer paper that is currently used in ignition furnaces for materials testing that would not meet the requirements, so we will need to adjust there is this legislation passes.
