You must not attempt to transport radioactive waste (and hazardous chemicals) in liquid form. Liquids always leak, and any leakage of radioactive waste along a transportation route is intrinsically catastrophic. Radioactive waste must be converted to solid form before transportation or any form of disposal.

Risk is determined by two factors: the percentage that represents the probability of the occurrence of the event times the potential cost of the event. If the potential cost is catastrophic, then any probability, even a low probability, is unacceptable.

I would like to add that I understand that the proposed transportation route crosses indigenous territory. I do not want us to treat indigenous peoples this way, in addition to all the trauma already caused to them by us settler colonial peoples.
