Cooke Aquaculture has proven, time and again, that they cannot be trusted to operate these net pens in a way that honors and protects the Puget Sound and its wildlife. The waste and disease produced by net pen aquaculture threatens our wild salmon and steelhead, our Southern Resident Killer Whales, and the long-term health of the Puget Sound and its residents. These net pens, even with increased oversight and management from our state resource agencies, are not welcome in Puget Sound. It is high time for our resource agencies to do right by the people of this state and to phase out these operations entirely. No more net pens. Please.
