Please allow for the lists to be expansive and flexible for the Preliminary Statewide Collection Lists.

Including all the plastic numbering coded recyclables will allow Service Providers to be reimbursed for recycling efforts.

The Preliminary Statewide Collection lists are to please include, all plastic types (Polyethylene terephthalate #1 rPET, PET, PETE)

(High-density polyethylene HDPE #2)

(Polyvinyl chloride PVC)

(Low-density polyethylene LDPE #4)

(Polypropylene PP #5)

(Polystyrene PS #6)

(Other including bisphenol A BPA polycarbonate and bio-based plastics #7)

(1,2,3,4,5,6,7) and all colors of the 7 types of plastics and transparency to opaque characteristics of the plastics.

Including rPET #1 with PET and PETE.

Aluminum (Alu), glass all types GL 70 Mixed Glass, GL 71 Clear Glass, GL 72 Green Glass (Broken and whole).

Paper PAP 20 Cardboard, PAP 21 Plain Paper, PAP 22 Mixed Paper.

and compostable papers.

Scrap papers and shredded paper can be pulped and made into new paper and or made into art project materials.

All metals to be on the Preliminary Statewide Collection Lists. Including gold, silver, copper, steel, cast iron (iron). Check The Periodic Table of Elements if more metals need to be listed please Post-Transition Metals like Scandium, Titanium, Vanadium, Chromium, Manganese, Cobalt, Nickel, and Zinc, and Cadmium, Platinum, and Gold and Mercury. And the Transition Metals like Gallium, Indium, Tin, Thallium, Lead, and Bismuth.

Wood with compost and or reusable.

Other elements that may need to be listed on the Preliminary Statewide Collection lists include;

Textiles and furniture,

Lithium (Lithium batteries)

Silicon (often confused for plastics and rubbers but have different atomic mass, weight and structures.)

Fluoride (inside of toothpaste tubes).

Oxygen tanks.

PRO labeling "made in" geographic information should be accurate.

PRO to please use a correct United States and territories map including all 50 states and territories.

This map on the REUSABLE/ REFILL Bic lighter package only shows 48 states and is geographically incorrect. (IMG_4543.png). In the "made in" , assembly and parts information section on the packaging.

PRO to add instructions and symbol for reuse/refill on products. (IMG_4551.png)

PRO to please add to "Film plastic covered composite paper food packaging" labels and instructions to recycle similar to "empty and rinse", "empty rinse" paper and plastic recycle. (IMG_3584.jpeg)

PRO can and has labeled products with instructions and recycle labels and product material type,

and ADA compliance of a product and dentist recommendations and age recommendations and dosage for example on toothpaste. (IMG_4562.jpeg)

PRO could label known allergen products with warning labels. Increasing warnings from "do not give to children under age 2" to "do not give to children before allergy test" for peanut products for example. Or increasing warnings on products such as "do not give to children before seeing and talking to a doctor" on warning labels on products.

Paper product labels that have technology security tag sensors need to have collection specifications and recycling label instructions please. (3355.jpeg) Such as e-cycle.

Ceramics and household items need to be listed on the preliminary statewide collection list please.

Artists and cement workers can use scrap pieces of ceramics in mosaics and concrete path walk pavers.

The Preliminary Statewide Collection Lists cover what materials will be reimbursable for Service Providers. Please have the ecology department evaluate the reimbursement requirements for the Service Providers. Based on the Preliminary Statewide Collection Lists will the labor, the fuel, the equipment costs be reimbursed per line item? Is there a threshold weight and or volume requirement for reimbursement to the Service Providers?

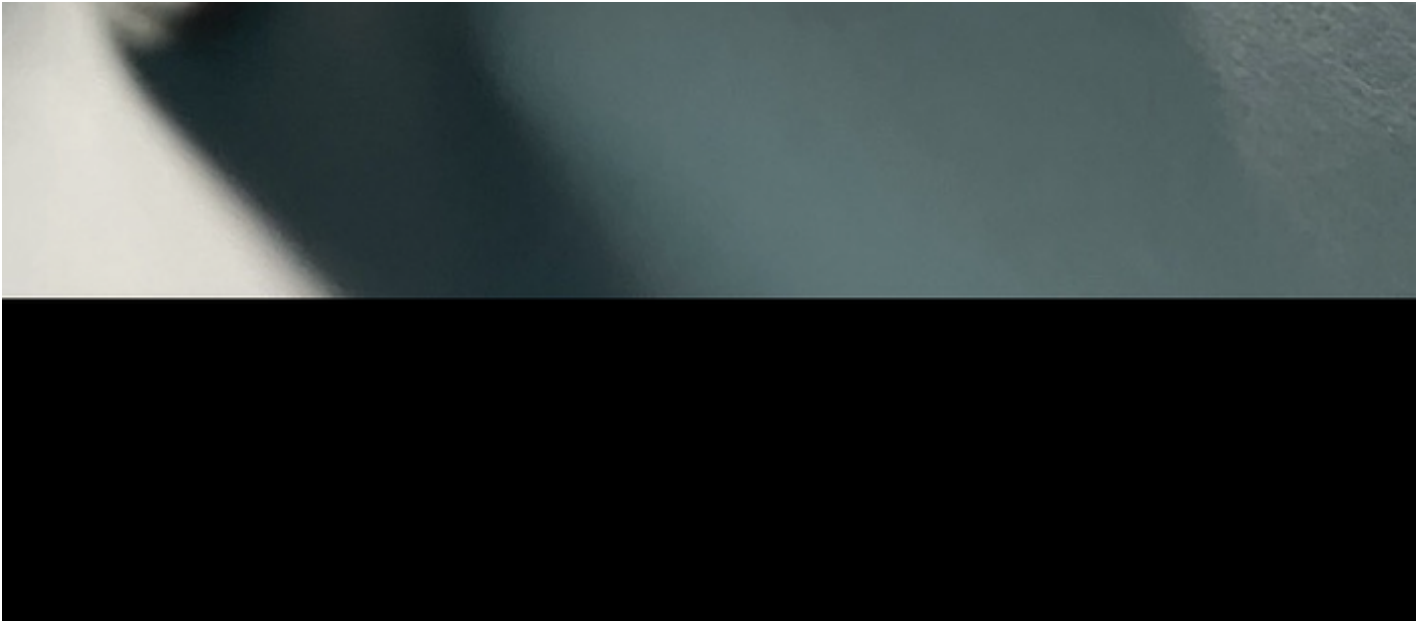
Will there be reimbursement per covered material? Will there be reimbursement per month or per year starting in 2029 or 2030 when the program starts for the Service Providers? Based on the Preliminary Statewide Collection Lists will reimbursement account for expenses that started for Service Providers in January 2026 when the Recycling Reform Act Service Providers registered with the Secure Access Ecology Department of Washington state or will reimbursements start accruing in 2029 or 2030 when the program starts? Will time, labor and equipment costs be reimbursable for the Service Providers?
