I am writing to express my support for Cooke Aquaculture Steelhead Trout farming. It is my understanding that Cooke Aquaculture Pacific has applied for permits to transition to raising all-female triploid steelhead trout in its Washington state net pens.

Steelhead trout are a native species to Washington and Triploid organisms are normally sterile as their lack of homologous chromosomes prevents pairing during meiosis cannot reproduce, therefore mitigating any opportunity for wild-farmed fish interactions.

Raising sterile fish will minimize the risk of genetic interference to local Steelhead stocks. This is a scientifically proven solution and would allow Cooke Aquaculture Pacific to continue to provide healthy and sustainable seafood products to their West Coast customers, while at the same time creating employment and business opportunities for Americans in the communities in which they operate.

The United States imports over 90% of the seafood it consumes. There is no reason we could not be producing more of our own seafood domestically.
