As residents of West Shore on Guemes Island, directly across Bellingham Channel from Cooke's Cypress Island facility during the 2017 pen failure and breakout, we witnessed the event firsthand. Cooke was repeatedly unreliable in its maintenance of the pens, even following repeated warnings. This lack of maintenance resulted in the pen failure.
