As the Pacific Northwest has faced unprecedented wildfires and resulting hazardous air quality in the past three years, now is not the time to introduce a facility that will surely contribute to increased greenhouse emissions, given a greater than 3% methane leak (which would likely occur during fracking, transportation, processing into methanol).
