During that time NWIW has continued to meet the requirements to obtain the necessary permits for this project. A lot of conditions they have far exceeded that as well. For example the projects incorporation of the 0 water discharge in the design and commitment to mitigate for 100% of emissions first day of Washington. The year-long review included the project will most likely result in reduction of 6 million tons-- carbon emissions globally. That is twice the amount of carbon emitted from the city. Some have chosen to ignore the benefits this can bring. I would say it does not stop at country's borders or state lines, in addition to this plant having a net reduction in GHG's globally there are a few benefits we will see as well such as 1000 plus local family with jobs during the three-year construction phase.
