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I would like to see the WA Dept of Ecology to apply its own guidance for integration in floodplain management. This was the guidance provided in the Integrated Floodplain Management Status Report supported by the WA Dept of Ecology. Refer to page 8 in the following PDF, https://www.floodplainsbydesign.org/wp-content/uploads/2018/08/Toward-a-New-Paradigm_IFM-Status-Report.pdf. Goals, collaboration, participants, action, and climate impacts are best integrated as ranked on that page. Full integration should be the only outcome of such a large project. The Tribes and public are watching and looking for leadership and stewardship both within the basin and the state. I do not see it here with a dam proposal. Diverting the routing and storage of water (and sediment) to other locations just displaces the hazards to other properties. Land uses need to be consistent with the risk tolerance over that extent. The only fair solution is to create a river corridor WITH a floodplain where process and flooding can occur, essentially giving the river room, as opposed to displacing hazards, not to mention the ecological and Tribal impacts.
