Responses to Ecology's Questions, Distributed 11/19/24, Related to the Cap-and-Invest Linkage Rulemaking

Big Bend Electric Cooperative (BBEC) is a small rural utility in eastern Washington providing electrical service to farmers, ranchers and homes in mainly non-urban areas of Adams and Franklin counties. We serve approximately 10,000 meters over 2,500 square miles with fewer than 50 employees.

We support TEA's comments submitted as part of this comment period.

Specifically, Ecology should strike its proposed language on Balancing Energy for in state resources as TEA has commented. Big Bend Electric is working hard on contracting directly with renewable energy developers to construct projects locally to supply clean, non-emitting generation as part of our power generation portfolio. As part of our BPA wholesale power contract, BBEC is required to purchase Balancing Energy from BPA for these projects.

As proposed, the Balancing Energy rule would create a compliance by assigning emissions to the contracted renewable energy resource. This concept goes against Washington State's policy goals of promoting new renewable energy resources.

We strongly encourage Ecology to <u>not</u> adopt the proposed definition of electricity importer to include Balancing Energy.
