The Delaware Valley is a source of drinking water, both for major urban areas and for the towns, countryside and wilderness regions throughout the watershed. Therefore, not only hydraulic fracking would pose an unacceptable risk - in fact a near certainty - of poisoning water sources in the watershed, also withdrawing water for use in fracking or disposal of wastewater from fracking in the watershed are unacceptable activities.
