Commissioners,

We are writing to let you know that we support a full ban on high-volume hydraulic fracturing and all related infrastructure, including pipelines, in the Delaware River Basin.

As you know, the Delaware River Basin covers 13,000 sq. miles of land in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware, and New York and provides drinking water to 15 million residents basin-wide. For almost seven years, the Delaware River Basin Commission has rightfully prevented gas extraction in the Delaware River Basin while it studies the impacts of those activities on water resources

Without a permanent fracking ban, residents in the Delaware River Basin could be faced with well pads, compressor stations, drilling rigs, and countless miles of pipeline construction. In the neighboring Susquehanna River Basin alone, there have been nearly 5,500 unconventional wells drilled since 2007 -- and 27,600 additional wells could be drilled by 2030, according to the Nature Conservancy.

Meanwhile, the Delaware River Basin remains untouched during the Marcellus Shale boom and bust due to the foresight of our Delaware River Basin Commissioners. We look forward to this being made permanent through the proposed rules. Once trees are clear cut, wells are drilled, and water is contaminated, there is no going back.

We also ask that the Commissioners strengthen their proposed rules to ban water withdrawals for fracking outside of the basin and prevent the storage of wastewater from fracking operations. The Commissioners should also broaden the definition of high-volume hydraulic fracturing to include non-water base fluids.

On behalf of our nearly 140,000 members and supporters in Pennsylvania, thank you for protecting our natural resources, for preserving recreational opportunities and their economic benefit, and for conserving our wild places for current and future generations that depend on clean water.
