

My name is Inge Grafe-Kieklack. I'm a landowner of New York State and a member of the UDRBC in New York. After listening through the last hours, let's get back to basics and reasoning. In 1961, you commissioned that DRBC was created to manage the water resources of the Delaware River Basin.

Its mission was to act as steward in protecting the surface and groundwater quality of the Basin by regulating land for strong conservation and the protection of sensitive areas in the basin.

The Commission's water quality protection was to attain --- was to obtain through sound science balancing economic concerns with environmental needs. Core value of the Commission, includes listening and responding to your constituents in order to improve your knowledge. Thank you for this opportunity.

In order to access sound science, I suggest you look to your sister River Commission, the SRBC, to learn from

their years of experience. Their territory situated just a few miles west of yours includes some of the most concentrated gas territories in the country.

Since 2006, the SRBC has monitored ground and surface water in the catch basin area, in both head waters and down river. By 2013, they had almost 60 sites uploaded data --- data to satellites continues 27 365 days. The data was open source available simultaneously through the property.

For this data, the SRBC has supported no negative impact and no degradation trends in ground and surface water.
