On the DRBC website it states: "The Delaware River Basin includes four states, 42 counties, and 838 municipalities. Over 15 million people (approximately five percent of the nation's population) rely on the waters of the Delaware River Basin for drinking, agricultural, and industrial use, but the watershed drains only four-tenths of one percent of the total continental U.S. land area. The 15 million figures include about seven million people in New York City and northern New Jersey who live outside the basin. New York City gets roughly half its water from three large reservoirs located on tributaries to the Delaware."

I am concerned that the fracking waste water will pollute the Delaware River in my area. I rely on this water for drinking, washing, cooking and for other personal needs. The DRBC is supposed to protect these waters for the citizens of the four states who rely on this water.
