Sirs, I am very concerned about the proposed permit to discharge into the waters of Wyoming for several reasons. 1) In the last 10 years Wyoming DEQ has identified 117 impaired waters in the state. Our Conservation District, along with others, helped to form Watershed Management groups who created plans to mitigate impairment. I believe that issuing this permit would further impair the watershed of Boysen Reservoir and waters downstream. 2) Given the proposed amount of discharge daily, my question is "Where are they getting that volume of water from?" 3) Wyoming is a national watershed state with 12 major watersheds originating here. It is our ethical and moral (and probably water law legal) duty to keep our waters as clean, potable, and safe as we can. 4) I am concerned about a plume of salty water spilling into aquatic habitat daily. Boysen has been very low during the time I have lived here. What happens then to dilution?? 5) Finally, issuing this permit to impair a major watershed system would set a precedent that is not acceptable. Clean water trumps profit every time.
