As an indigenous person to these lands, I do not believe that eliciting SMR's on State lands is a wise decision. When there was an SMR on ft. Greely it raised many eyebrows and was shut down on the increasing possibility that we'd have a Chernobyl all over again. Eliciting SMR's is a false solution to a growing problem if and we would not be outsourcing a existing problem but creating many more for the future of Alaska.
