- 1 VANESSA BLEVINS: Yes, thanks.
- 2 You know, I think that trying to make many aspects
- of the regs totally flexible, where you could waive
- 4 any part of, you know, Section 200 in the
- 5 engineering section of 18 AAC 72, seems -- you
- 6 know, I understand you want to do that to help meet
- 7 the needs of a specific circumstance. The problem
- 8 is it makes the plan reviews totally unpredictable.
- 9 And nobody expects plan reviews to be consistent.
- 10 I mean, the conditions in the state vary from place
- 11 to place, but there has to be a high level of
- 12 predictability in what you expect to have to do to
- 13 meet a regulation. And so injecting all of those
- 14 multiple variables in there goes the other way, and
- 15 it makes the plan reviews take a lot longer, and
- 16 it's a lot less of an efficient process for
- 17 everybody involved.
- 18 And so I guess I would urge you to
- 19 look for opportunities to make the plans more
- 20 predictable, not less predictable.
- 21 And that's it.
