# **Description of the Little Falls Wastewater Treatment Facility**

This is a Class A facility.

The Facility discharges continuously (SD004) to the Mississippi River (Class 1C, 2Bdg, 3, 4A, 4B, 5, 6 water). The Facility is designed to treat an average wet weather (AWW) flow of 2.4 million gallons per day (MGD), an average annual flow of 1.9 MGD. and an average dry weather (ADW) flow of 1.1 MGD, with a five day carbonaceous biochemical oxygen demand (CBOD<sub>5</sub>) strength of 177 milligrams per liter (mg/L).

Major Components of the existing Wastewater Treatment Facility (WWTF) consist of:

- 1 Equalization Tank
- 1 Influent Flow Meter (parshall flume)
- 1 Bar Screen Manual
- 1 Bar Screen Mechanical
- 1 Vortex Grit Removal
- 2 Anaerobic/Anoxic selector tanks
- 2 Activated Sludge oxidation ditch
- 2 Final Clarifiers
- 1 UV disinfection
- 1 Post-aeration (cascading aeration)
- 2 Aerated digesters
- 1 Centrifuge
- 1 Covered Dewatered Biosolids Storage Area
- 1 Land Application of Biosolids

https://www.pca.state.mn.us 651-296-6300 800-657-3864 Use your preferred relay service Available in alternative formats t-admin20-01 • LB 1062 • 8/18/22 Page 1 of 2 The WWTF consist of influent flow monitoring with a parshall flume, a mechanically raked screen, a manually raked bypass screen, a vortex grit removal system, a flow equalization basin, two anaerobic selector tanks with mixing, two oxidation ditches set up for biological phosphorus removal, backup chemical phosphorus removal system, two final clarifiers, and an ultraviolet light disinfection system followed by cascade aeration prior to discharge. The proposed solids handling will consist of two aerobic digesters, biosolids dewatering with a centrifuge, dewatered biosolids cake storage in a building, and land application of biosolids and/or used by the county landfill.

Southeast Lift Station Bypass and West Lift Station Bypass are capable of discharging untreated wastewater to the Mississippi River. The treatment Facility also has a Bypass/Overflow point from the flow equalization basin to the outfall pipe.

The preliminary determination to reissue this Wastewater permit is tentative.

## Procedure for public participation

As stated in Minn. R. chs. 7000 and 7001, there are three formal procedures for public participation in the MPCA's consideration of this matter. Interested persons may:

- 1) Submit written comments on the draft permit.
- 2) Petition the MPCA to hold a public informational meeting.
- 3) Petition the MPCA to hold a contested case hearing.

Submitted comments or petitions must state:

- 1) Your interest in the permit application or the draft permit.
- The action you wish the MPCA to take, including specific references to the section of the draft permit you believe should be
- The reasons supporting your position, stated with sufficient specificity as to allow the MPCA to investigate the merits of the position.

# **Public informational meeting**

A public informational meeting is an informal meeting during which interested persons can ask questions concerning the proposed facility. MPCA staff will be present to provide information. If an interested person would like the MPCA to hold a public informational meeting, the person should include all information identified above and in addition include a statement of the reasons the person desires the MPCA to hold a public informational meeting and the issues that the person would like the agency to address at the public informational meeting.

## **Contested Case Hearing**

A contested case hearing is a formal proceeding before an administrative law judge empowered to advise the MPCA regarding issues of fact. As described in Minn. R. 7000.1800, persons who submit petitions for a contested case hearing must also state the issues they propose to address in a contested case hearing, the specific relief requested or resolution of the matter, and the reasons (which may be in the form of proposed findings) supporting an MPCA decision to hold a contested case hearing. Failure to comply with these rules exactly may result in a denial of the request. To the extent known, the petitioner may also submit a list of prospective witnesses to be called at a hearing, a proposed list of publications, references, or studies to be introduced at a hearing and the approximate time required for the petitioner to present the matter at a hearing. The decision whether to hold a contested case hearing will be made under Minn. R. 7000.1900.

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
