That is a barrier.) Free curbside pickup of clothing, towels, rugs, other textiles to be recycled or taken to Goodwill. Make recycling/composting/donating as easy as possible for the average person.

Check out Ridwell.com--a new company that takes items that don't go in normal recycling. You could contract with them to cover the entire metro area.
