Per bag fee on all bags at grocery and retail stores - require produce bags be bio-degradable.

Add a surcharge based on the volume of residential waste containers 32gal = \$1x, 96gal = 5x

Require refundable or trade-in deposits on large appliances, furniture and electronics (same as is currently done with car batteries)

Phase-in single hauler systems for all cities (can be single by neighborhood rather than city) - right now I have at least 5 different haulers just on my block. Helps reduce, traffic, noise and road wear.

Phase out or tax direct-mail advertisements and promotions.

Require communities above a certain size to open recycling centers - see Coon Rapids

Offer tax-rebates/credits for recycling large items - Right now it's \$30-50 to recycle old TV's and electronics, it would be nice to get a tax-credit slip to take that money off the taxable income at reporting time.

Require haulers to send an annual report on waste disposal, how much and where it went.

Promote relaxing ordinances regarding garage sales, swap meets, and free/giveaway piles.

Find a way to get larger commericial spaces to clean up the parking lot detritus (wrappers, receipts, bags, etc) that accumulates on their property and bordering properties.

I see a number of organizations collecting cans or bottles as a fundraiser, offer a bonus for recycling large amounts to increase this style of collection.

Phase in requiring all large events / venues / vendors to provide 100% recyclable, reusable or compostable food and drink containers (Stadiums, Hotels, Wedding venues, State/County/Local fairs)

Add a solid waste fee tied to the increase/decrease of trash going to landfills.

Allow dumpster scavaging.
