Comments, petitions, and other requests must be received at the MPCA in writing on or before the public comment period end date and U.S. Mail comments must be received by 4:30 p.m.

Description of permitted facility

Magellan Pipeline Company, L.P., owns and operates a liquid petroleum bulk storage terminal and interstate pipeline facility in Roseville, Minnesota. The facility consists of storage tanks, electric pumps stations, two tank truck loading racks with vapor collection systems and vapor combustion units (VCUs), and insignificant emission units. The terminal receives and transports petroleum and biofuel products to other terminals through an interstate pipeline distribution network.

Volatile organic compounds (VOCs) are the primary pollutant emitted from the facility, including volatile hazardous air pollutants (HAPs). Most VOC and HAP emissions are generated by truck loading operations at the facility's two truck loading racks. These emissions represent the fraction of VOCs and HAPs that are not completely collected or combusted by the facility's two VCUs that control emissions generated during truck loading operations. Additional emissions are from storage tank standing and working losses; tank floating roof landing events; and fugitive emissions from valves, pumps, and flanges.

The permit action is for operation of the facility. The permit action is the reissuance of the Part 70 operating permit; therefore, the draft permit has been placed on public notice.

The Permittee is not required to submit a pollution prevention progress report pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 115D.08.

The preliminary determination to reissue this Air permit is tentative.

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Procedure for public participation

As stated in Minn. R. chs. 7000 and 7001, there are three formal procedures for public participation in the MPCA's consideration of this matter. Interested persons may:

- 1) Submit written comments on the draft permit.
- 2) Petition the MPCA to hold a public informational meeting.
- 3) Petition the MPCA to hold a contested case hearing.

Submitting written comments

Submitted comments or petitions must state:

- 1) Your interest in the permit application or the draft permit.
- The action you wish the MPCA to take, including specific references to the section of the draft permit you believe should be changed.
- The reasons supporting your position, stated with sufficient specificity as to allow the MPCA to investigate the merits of the position.

Public informational meeting

A public informational meeting is an informal meeting during which interested persons can ask questions concerning the proposed facility. MPCA staff will be present to provide information. If an interested person would like the MPCA to hold a public informational meeting, the person should include all information identified above and in addition include a statement of the reasons the person desires the MPCA to hold a public informational meeting and the issues that the person would like the agency to address at the public informational meeting.

Contested Case Hearing

A contested case hearing is a formal proceeding before an administrative law judge empowered to advise the MPCA regarding issues of fact. As described in Minn. R. 7000.1800, persons who submit petitions for a contested case hearing must also state the issues they propose to address in a contested case hearing, the specific relief requested or resolution of the matter, and the reasons (which may be in the form of proposed findings) supporting an MPCA decision to hold a contested case hearing. Failure to comply with these rules exactly may result in a denial of the request. To the extent known, the petitioner may also submit a list of prospective witnesses to be called at a hearing, a proposed list of publications, references, or studies to be introduced at a hearing and the approximate time required for the petitioner to present the matter at a hearing. The decision whether to hold a contested case hearing will be made under Minn. R. 7000.1900.

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
