My main concern is whether the large vehicles exiting or entering the landfill area will be using the driveway that is currently connected to 239th Avenue NW. Years ago when the landfill built the driveway that leads onto 239th (and the traffic on 169 was lighter) there was concern with the number of vehicles trying to get on/off 169 because of the amount of traffic, speed and the number of accidents that occur at that intersection. The Sherburne County Board of Commissioners at that time understood the concerns of the citizens and voted not to allow that driveway connected to 239th to be used by the landfill. There have been so many accidents at that intersection, that the Township moved the street sign back off of the highway because it had been hit so many times. Cars traveling south hit the curve at 239th Ave. and lose control or, because of the speed and volume of traffic, it is very very difficult to merge onto 169. If large semi's and trucks use this entrance or exit, this will only increase the amount of accidents and injuries to public. There is no acceleration lane there for traffic from the landfill to merge onto 169.
