Requiring an Environmental Impact Statement for Riverview Dairy is essential. The proposed facility would be nearly double the size of any existing operation in the state, posing serious environmental risks.

**Water demand:** Riverview plans to draw up to 226 million gallons annually from an off-site well — comparable to nearly the entire water supply permitted for the City of Morris.

**Waste volume:** Operations would produce roughly 202.7 million gallons of liquid manure and wastewater per year, along with approximately 26,400 tons of solid waste.

**Unmapped groundwater:** Stevens County lacks a completed Geologic Atlas, and the required hydrologic survey hasn't started — meaning aquifer impacts from large withdrawals remain unknown.

**Vulnerable waterways:** The site drains into the Pomme de Terre watershed, a designated sensitive area. Both the Pomme de Terre River and a nearby creek are already classified as impaired and could face further degradation.

Issuing permits before these critical data gaps are filled is premature. The MPCA must require a full Environmental Impact Statement before this project moves forward.
