As someone who grew up in the Pojoaque Valley with the vast majority of my family still living in the Pojoaque Valley and as an advisory board member of Concerned Citizens for Nuclear Safety, I am angered that during Holy Week in New Mexico, when people are not able to participate in public meetings, the NM WQCC held a hearing during which the hearing officer recommended that CCNS and Honor Our Pueblo Existence (HOPE) not have legal standing in DP-1132.

I support standing for CCNS and HOPE in the DP-1132 petition for review before the NM Water Quality Control Commission. I rely on CCNS and HOPE to provide information and opportunities to take action to challenge the issuance of DP-1132 before the NM Environment Department and the NM Water Quality Control Commission.

Revoking their standing goes against federal precedence for cases of this nature.
