Nancy Arnaudville thanks the commissioners for holding public hearings on clean car and truck standards which will improve the lives of everyone in New Mexico. This isn't just about getting more clean vehicles on our roads. It's about more jobs, cleaner air, healthier lives, new transportation options, advancing equity and diversifying New Mexico's economy.

The Advanced Clean Cars and Trucks standards are an important step we can take now to deliver more affordable, clean, electric cars and trucks for people to drive, and reduce harmful air pollution that is impacting everyone, especially communities that live along transportation routes. This will deliver substantial benefits of lower transportation costs, less air pollution, more jobs and less extreme weather. Which is necessary for Albuquerque's future generations to grow up in a city with healthier air quality.

Switching to electric vehicles would greatly reduce pollution. It would help in gas prices and possibly peace instead of war because I think there have been wars over oil. It would save money in low income families getting to work or appointments.
