I support the proposed rule to increase the threshold for zero emissions vehicles in dealerships across the state.

After much research I purchased an EV this summer and I was frustrated by by the lack of purchasing options available locally. I had decided on a base model with a few options. I found cars meeting my desired trim/options out of state, but given the logistics and cost in dollars and time, I ended up purchasing a fully optioned high end model in Albuquerque, because that was all that was available in the state. I was also disappointed by the lack of knowledge of the entire staff at the dealership regarding EVs. I was much more knowledgeable on the car than they were.
