I am opposed to the proposal to bring another potential fire hazard into our community. Residents in this area already face ongoing environmental concerns, including dust and dirt blowing from the old city dump, where sludge from the former sewer treatment plant was hauled, particularly during east canyon winds.

In addition, Broadway is already struggling to support existing heavy traffic and infrastructure demands, and its condition continues to deteriorate. The highway is not equipped to safely accommodate an estimated 400 large trash trucks per day.

Our neighborhood is already surrounded by heavily impacted industrial facilities, including the old railroad tie treatment plant, abandoned slaughter plants, sewer treatment operations, and numerous junkyards. Our community has carried more than its share of environmental burdens. We do not believe it is appropriate to bring waste from other counties into our neighborhood and add further strain to our environment, roads, and quality of life.
