I oppose the Broadway Transfer Station permit.

Just last Saturday, 4220 Broadway Blvd SE, recycling facility burned approximately two acres. That fire is a stark reminder that the cumulative impacts of industrial and waste facilities are real, and they matter.

Mountain View should not be expected to accept additional traffic, pollution, noise, and safety risks from waste generated outside of the community. Property owners should not see their neighborhood quality decline because of regional waste disposal needs, and our children should not bear the consequences of decisions that benefit other areas.

Approving another waste facility threatens future housing investment, economic development, and neighborhood revitalization efforts. This community has carried more than its fair share of these burdens.

Enough is enough. NMED should deny this permit and protect the health, safety, and future of Mountain View residents.
