Southern New Mexico is hot at least 6 months of the year. Adding the additional burden of year-round paperwork will not change that. Limiting work hours will essentially bring construction to a halt for 6 months of the year. Maybe everyone could shift construction to all night work, but I think the number of accidents would actually increase due to the hazards of working in poorly illuminated areas. We all struggle to keep qualified labor as it is. Making construction workers change their lifestyles in the summer will most likely drive most of them to change trades. Please table this proposal.
