

Subject: Public Comment **Opposing** Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC and Project Jupiter

To the New Mexico Environment Department:

I am writing as a Native woman, mother, and Auntie mama to strongly urge you to **REJECT** the permit application for Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC and Project Jupiter. This project threatens the health, safety, and cultural heritage of our communities, and it disregards the sacred responsibility we hold to protect the land for future generations.

Project Jupiter poses significant risks to our environment, including:

- **Water Contamination:** New Mexico's water resources are already scarce and vulnerable. The project could pollute groundwater and surface water, threatening the health of families, wildlife, and sacred sites.
- **Air Quality:** Increased industrial activity risks releasing harmful pollutants, disproportionately affecting Indigenous communities and low-income families.
- **Soil Degradation:** The project could lead to long-term soil contamination, making it difficult to sustain traditional agriculture or foraging practices.
- **Climate Impact:** Expanding fossil fuel infrastructure contradicts New Mexico's climate goals and exacerbates the climate crisis, which harms all NM communities.

As a Native woman and mother, I am deeply concerned about the cultural and spiritual harm this project will cause:

- We have a sacred duty to protect the land for those yet to be born. This project threatens to leave behind a legacy of pollution, loss, and suffering, rather than a healthy and thriving environment.
- Our Tribal communities must have a meaningful say in decisions that affect lands and waters. The voices of Native people—who are often the keepers of traditional ecological knowledge—must be centered in this process.

I urge the New Mexico Environment Department to:

1. **REJECT** the permit application for Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC and Project Jupiter.
2. Prioritize the health and well-being of New Mexico's communities, especially for our future generations.
3. Uphold environmental justice by ensuring that no community bears the brunt of pollution and environmental harm.
4. Center Indigenous leadership in decisions about land and resource use.

This project is not just about economics—it is about ethics, justice, and the legacy we leave for our children. I implore you to act with integrity and compassion, and to **REJECT** Project Jupiter in the strongest possible terms.
