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Water sustains all life. Water is life. Water is not an infinite resource. The Rio Grande is dry, we're in a multi year extreme drought, and questions are being raised about the sustainability of our current water usage. Because of this it is imperative for our communities to be heard and upheld especially concerning Project Jupiter. The public should be given an additional 60 days to review and comment on the air quality permit so community members can participate equitably. And/or legislation put into place to ban all data centers state wide. There are detrimental effects of allowing Project Jupiter to continue. I spent all last week in downtown Albuquerque talking to Project Jupiter Canvassers. These are not people advocating for anything they care about. Most of them aren't even fully aware of what they're being paid to do. Project Jupiter is preying on our community by paying folks to not be transparent in order to access signatures in their favor. However, I know that when I speak to people about this happening they are outraged and unaware. And that's the only way this could ever get pushed through. By using money to claw their way in. I point this out because it shows that Project Jupiter's only goal in coming here is to use their money to extract from the land and people and to then put more money in their own pockets. The air quality permit application should be denied outright given Bloom Energy's history of illegal dumping hazardous waste. Approving this permit would be government-sponsored environmental racism directed at residents of Doña Ana County. If the permit is not denied outright, a public hearing needs to be held in Santa Teresa, in both English and Spanish, with an option to participate virtually.
