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Stop putting everyone at risk because of something there isnt needed for the survival of humanity. The amount of water the data centers take harm both the community, as there water becomes undrinkable, and the wild life surrounding it. We live in a world where water isnt accessible to everyone, which is insanely wrong as water is a necessity for living and humans nor any other living creature cant go without it. Low class people who dont have the ability to move away from their living space, which are close to said data centers, get stuck there while practically being unable to do anything but suck it up. The public should be given an additional 60 days to review and comment on the air quality permit so community members can participate equitably.

The air quality permit application should be denied outright given Bloom Energy's history of illegal dumping hazardous waste. Approving this permit would be government-sponsored environmental racism directed at residents of Doña Ana County.

If the permit is not denied outright, a public hearing needs to be held in Santa Teresa, in both English and Spanish, with an option to participate virtually.
