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Project Jupiter must not move forward. Data centers are known to pollute the land, air, and water of the communities they are built in. The sound pollution alone is detrimental to the quality of life of both human and animal residents. Bloom Energy already has a bad record with waste management of their sites. Their air quality permit application should be denied based on this. The community has a right to be heard in a public hearing should this move forward. We must oppose this project. We must listen to and follow the wishes of the communities that would be impacted by this site. Not a single site like this has improved the lives of the communities they exist in. As we head into a super el Niño year with already record breaking heat the last thing new mexico should be approving is a site estimated to produce astronomical amounts of CO2 that will only further negatively impact the environment.

The public should be given an additional 60 days to review and comment on the air quality permit so community members can participate equitably.

The air quality permit application should be denied given Bloom Energy's history of illegal dumping hazardous waste.

If the permit is not denied, a public hearing needs to be held in Santa Teresa, in both English and Spanish, with an option to participate virtually.

Approving this permit would be government-sponsored environmental racism as residents of Doña Ana County are already disproportionately impacted by environmental pollution.
