Dear NMED staff, I am writing because I am concerned about the risks and harm Project Jupiter faces to our planet. I am submitting this comment to urge the New Mexico Environment Department to reject Yucca Growth infrastructure, LLC's air permit application for the YGI Microgrid in Doña Ana County. I may not be a resident of New Mexico, I actually live in a whole different continent, but I am still worried that this data center will seriously harm people living in New Mexico. The project's proposed fuel cell powered grid is concerning for many reasons: -It would still produce a high level of greenhouse gas and toxic pollutants -This technology generates toxic waste, and the process for handling this waste is still unclear. -Fuel cell technology or a centralized waste system has never occurred at this scale. -Surrounding communities' air will be negatively impacted by this development. I urge the NMED to outright reject YUCCA Yucca Growth Infrastructure, LLC's air permit application for the YGI Microgrid. I ask the department to please hold a bilingual public hearing near the Santa Teresa community, so that residents can learn about the risks associated with fuel cell technology.
