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We do not need data centers. We need to protect the already fragile ecosystems of New Mexico and the climate globally. The people have already said no time and time again in public forums. We DO NOT want this. Allowing development irresponsible and is a form of environmental racism. There needs to be more time given for the community of New Mexico to submit their comments, at least 60 additional days. All public hearings and ways to submit comments need to be available in English and Spanish, and people need to be able to attend and speak virtually. The air quality permit for Project Jupiter needs to be denied because of Bloom Energy's history of illegal hazardous waste dumping. This HAS to be stopped. The mission statement of NMED is to protect and restore New Mexico's environment and creating opportunities for current and future generations. The air quality bureau of NMED aims to protect the health of current and future generations and the beauty of the state. By allowing this project to continue you are failing at these missions. If Project Jupiter is allowed to continue under your watch, then you lose all trust and respect from the people you claim to be supporting and protecting. This project if allowed to continue will destroy and poison not only the land, air, and water, but also the people who depend on it, who call New Mexico their home.

The public should be given an additional 60 days to review and comment on the air quality permit so community members can participate equitably.

The air quality permit application should be denied outright given Bloom Energy's history of illegal dumping hazardous waste. Approving this permit would be government-sponsored environmental racism directed at residents of Doña Ana County.

If the permit is not denied outright, a public hearing needs to be held in Santa Teresa, in both English and Spanish, with an option to participate virtually.
